
Focus Canada 2011 National Survey

- Conducted annually by the non-profit Environics Institute
- Public interest research for public use
- 2011 survey conducted in November-December by telephone with representative sample of 1,500 Canadians
- Covered wide range of issues, including income inequality, taxation, and the role of government















2011 Strong agreement – by party affiliation









Satisfaction with current standard of living




General opinion of large corporate profits

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
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




Taxes fundamentally positive or negative?.















Main cause of problems with health care system




Support for carbon tax in B.C.

B.C. 2008 – 2011




Support for introducing B.C.-style carbon tax in own province

Rest of Canada 2008 – 2011




Support for B.C.-style carbon tax in own province





Where Canadians stand on income inequality

- Income inequality is emerging as a public issue
- Canadians look to government for solutions
- The issue remains symbolic and unfocused -
 - Most Canadians are doing OK financially don't see personal impact
 - Unclear what the problem is or who is responsible
 - Unclear what the solutions might be
- Connection not made to current tax system

Where Canadians stand on taxes

- Taxes are never popular but not always toxic problems lie in the application not the principle
- Lowering taxes is not a major fixation for most Canadians
- Current tax "frame" remains a major obstacle
 - No compelling narrative for "positive" value of taxes
 - General skepticism about where the revenue goes
 - Public no longer trusts promises by elites

What's needed to build public support for fair tax reform

- A powerful narrative about taxes as a positive force
- Tax policies the public can accept
 - Clearly linked to reducing inequality and other public benefits
 - Seen as fairly applied everyone participates, and no one suffers unduly
 - Incremental rather than revolutionary
- Many and varied champions
 - Good policy won't sell itself messengers as important as the message
 - Expand beyond partisan political arena
 - Broad spectrum of endorsement



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
